


Mission of the Month - David's Refuge

Our guests enjoy the beauty, hospitality and relaxation of a personally designed retreat in a luxurious Bed & Breakfast, where meals, recreation, and opportunities for 'unplugging' are generously provided. Our goal is to provide a place of respite from the demands of caring for children and family so clients can be restored, refreshed, and revived.

Parenting a child with special needs is demanding. As a result of this stress, marriages fail, families crumble, and very often hope is lost. During a stay at David's Refuge clients are pampered, encouraged, and reminded that they are not alone, that God loves them, and that what they do really matters.




Administration - work with church staff and pastors to plan and execute events.

CHRISTIAN: NOT WHAT YOU THINK



A group of Christian surveyors went out to a random city with a video camera and asked two questions:

1. What's your opinion of Jesus Christ?
2. What's your opinion of Christians?

The responses to the first question were overwhelmingly positive with such words and phrases as "Awesome", "He's my savior", "I love that guy", "He's all about peace", "forgiveness", and "wise".

The responses to the second question were overwhelmingly negative with such words and phrases as "Judgmental", "Intolerant", "Hypocrite", "Hate", and "They are a bunch of nuts".

If people have such a high view of Jesus Christ, then why did these respondents have such a low view of Christians? Christians are supposed to follow and represent Jesus Christ. The responses to both questions should be identical. Perhaps we need to look at the data of what is going on in the pew and on the street.

In the early 1990s, about two out of 10 U.S. adults were churchless. In the early 2000s, it was three in 10. Today, the churchless make up nearly half the adult population. Today, about 156 million U.S. adults and children are churchless.

In spite of America's "Christian" self-description, there is a growing sense among North American Christ-followers that the culture is changing faster than we can keep up with or respond to—and we're not always sure how to live faithfully in a world that feels like it's headed off the rails. Not too many years ago, church attendance and basic Bible literacy were the cultural norm. Being a Christian didn't feel like swimming against the cultural current.

The raw number of unchurched people in the United States is staggering. Most of what gets counted as "church growth" is actually transfer growth, rather than conversion growth—that is, people transferring their allegiance from one church to another, not transitioning from non-Christian to Christ-follower. If churches hope to grow by discipling new believers, we must improve our ability to attract those who are intentionally avoiding a connection with a church.

The fact is many people are looking for a meaningful faith community experience, but they do not want to go to "that" church. The perception of "churches" among the religiously unaffiliated is that churches are full of Christians who are judgmental, inflexible, immature, hateful, and hypocritical.

How can we as Christians change this perception?

Instead of blaming the media or public misconceptions, we Christians (specifically, DeWitt Community Church) need to look at ourselves and must change the way we are perceived. The only way to change the perception is to look deep within our faith practice and see what behaviors are the most damning to the image of Christ. Clearly, people have a positive view on Jesus. It is not his teaching that is a problem. The problem is with us. The way Christians behave reflects perceptions concerning what God is like. If we are angry and bitter Christians, then people are going to think God and our church is angry and bitter.

The reality is many people use Christianity, but they do not live it. Some Christians feel that they can use Christianity and their beliefs to bully, oppress, and persecute non-believers and even other Christians. If we Christians understand what it really means to be a Christian as a disciple of Jesus, then we can turn the tide of Christian perception.

I pray you will begin the journey of rediscovery of what means to be a Christian in this New Year.
