
New Hymnals

Our brand new hymnals arrived on June 13th and we will begin using them for worship in September. This is an exciting chance to further enhance our worship experience at DeWitt Community Church by incorporating different music into our service.

I'm sure there are some of you that are wondering why we needed a new hymnal. That is a fair question. To me, still the new guy, there are several challenges with the current hymnal, *The Worshipping Church* that are addressed by our new hymnal, *Worship and Rejoice*.

A hymnal is a reflection of its time. The Worshipping Church was

published in 1990. A hymnal usually requires between five and eight years to compile. Copyrights have to be secured, music needs to be edited, words need to be changed, songs have to be decided on, etc. This puts the actual "birthdate" of our current hymnal closer to 1982. At that time in church music we were just beginning to find our voice with praise and worship choruses. Many of the traditional hymns were being eschewed because of antiquated language, or occasionally included



as is and then avoided by church musicians out of fear that the congregation would not understand their meanings.

Fast forward to 2001 when "Worship and Rejoice" was published (again putting its birthdate closer to 1993) by this time the Contemporary Christian Worship movement had found a clear voice. The music that was being heard at several churches as expressions of worship had been written out and circulated. The language of the traditional hymns of the faith had begun to be updated to be both accessible and inclusive. Many hymn writers had begun to see the value of marrying their new poetic texts with the tunes that we all know and grew up with. This is what you will find in "Worship and Rejoice."

DCC Golf for Fun continues in July!

A few more features worth pointing out in this hymnal:

1. Print size - The font size of the lyrics and the size of the music is 1-2 font sizes larger than our current hymnal.



In addition, the quality of the print and the resolution on the significantly whiter pages makes it much easier to read.

- **2. Familiar hymns** This hymnal has all of the familiar hymns from our previous hymnal as well as some other old chestnuts that were not in our previous hymnal.
- **3. Contemporary music** This hymnal includes many of the Praise and Worship songs that have stood the test of time over the last thirty years and includes both the lyrics and the music. This makes them easier to learn and solves the issue of only seeing the words of an unfamiliar song.
- **4. New poetic texts** This hymnal includes new texts by prominent hymn writers set to familiar hymn tunes like BEACH SPRING, SLANE, and BUNESSAN.
- **5. Expanded resources** While our current hymnal has only a few hymns for Advent, Lent, Communion and other observations of the church year, this hymnal has many more options for these special celebrations that are important to our worship life.

Over the next few months we will be giving you the opportunity to contribute to this new asset. The cost of each book is \$15. Why not donate one (or more) in memory or in honor of a loved one. You could purchase one for you and one for a friend, or even enough for your whole family. We will also be having events to "get to know" the new hymnal like a hymn sing and possibly a carol sing during Advent. We have these wonderful new resources, and we should embrace all that they have to offer to enhance our worship.

A NOTE TO THE CONGREGATION —

My Dear DCC friends,

As my four year tenure as Vice President and then President of the Board of trustees comes to a close, I'd like to share some reflections of the past, celebrations of the present and dreams for the future.

We have made tremendous progress in the past several years. We have an amazing body of followers of Christ. In a time where many main line churches are declining and closing their doors, both in Syracuse and around the country, we are blessed not to be one of them. I am very thankful to be part of this congregation.

The renovation of our stone room into Miller Commons provides a fantastic new space for worship, fellowship events, lectures, dinners, bible studies, children's and youth programs and use by outside organizations. And our lay worship leader program, has added a fantastic new dimension to our worship services.

After a difficult time of staff transition, we now have individuals in almost every position we were seeking to fill. In the past year we have welcomed Executive Associate Pastor Alan Rudnick, Bookkeeper Jane Hahn. Communications Coordinator Peter Hawley, Youth Director Mary Chirello, Organist and Pianist Abel Searor, and Office Manager Jill Reid. Ellen Butler came on in 2015 as interim office manager and retires this month. She was crucial during this past year of transition, and we deeply thank her for her service.

Our Youth Program is under the new leadership of Mary Chirello. The youth program already has a strong partnership with Casey's place and will continue to grow as more of our youth work as volunteers. Mary is adding a youth group on Wednesday evenings for and a bible study on Monday nights at Jamesville Beach. DCC's youth continue to be

part of Summer Servants, volunteering in some of the most impoverished areas of Syracuse as a one week "mission trip" in our own back yard.

Our children's program and Sunday School are thriving. We have over 50 children enrolled in our Sunday school program. Vacation Bible School is a strong tradition at DCC. Many non-DCC children participate every year as well. This year we are trying something new. VBS will be over Winter Break, the week of February 20-24.

There are so many mission groups and ministries, it is impossible to mention them all. Under the leadership of Kay Paulsen, our compassion ministry touches the lives of so many people on a daily basis. Stephen ministry, prayer shawl ministry and prayer chain are just a few. Altar Guild works tirelessly behind the scenes to create a beautiful and welcoming atmosphere in our sanctuary as well as other spaces in our building. Our mission of the month ministry is going strong, touching and improving lives far beyond our walls. Thanks to our Circle Garden team, we have a beautiful, showcase garden calling people in the community to "come check us out!" Our hospitality team has grown over the past few years. This teams provides receptions and refreshments for many of our celebrations and fellowship events as well as memorial services. Our usher team works faithfully, week in and week out to provide a welcoming people atmosphere for entering our doors.

Our Women's Association is open to all women to come to DCC. Their financial support to the church has provided much needed upgrades to the parlor and the kitchen among many other spaces and has also supported the Capital Campaign. During the year, they coordinate several events which provide financial support and an opportunity for women to work together

in fellowship.

Sunday adult bible study has studied several books under the leadership of Debbie and Bob Marr and Mike and Nancy Leroy. Betsy Snyder's bible study group is going strong with a faithful weekly attendance. Our "golf for fun" group joins together every Thursday during the golf season for on the links enjoyment and fellowship. Our First Saturday Men's group, under the leadership of Bob Marr meets every month for both bible study and service projects.

In recent years we have sent teams of adults and youth to Rancho Grande, El Salvador, partnering with Holy Cross Church and Young Life. They worked in a medical clinic, cleared fields for irrigation and dug ditches to supply running water to the community. They also brought medical supplies, clothing and shoes. While their mission was to serve, they all felt as though the sense of community and compassion that they received was far more of a gift. A deep gratitude goes out to this team of people who have so generously of their time and efforts.

As a church that has been around for over 200 years, it is important to reflect back and celebrate our long history. Our history committee has spent countless hours combing through pictures documents and cataloguing them so that they are preserved for future generations. The history wall in the main hallway of the church tugs at our heartstrings as we stroll and view the photos that take us down memory lane.

There will always be more work to do and things we need to improve on. 2 ½ years ago, we had a legal firm conduct a constitutional review to examine our practices and by-laws within the context of the NY State Religious corporation laws. This review brought to light a few practices that will be

changed in order for us to be in full compliance of that law. As stewards of the church we love, we have an obligation to make sure we are running the business side of things in the most effective way.

For churches to thrive, they must offer a contemporary worship service in addition to traditional worship. We are no exception. Now that we have made it through this time of staff transition, it is my hope that we will be able to put a contemporary worship service back on the top of our agenda.

The final issue that we all need to be aware of and improve on is stewardship. In order for us to grow and thrive as a community of faith, we need to improve our giving as a congregation. A year ago through this period, contributions to the general funds were \$548,876 and this year through the same time period we have received \$480,070. If you are behind vs. your estimate of giving commitment, please do what you can to catch up. If you feel you are in a position to give in addition to your regular contribution, please consider doing so. The missions and ministries at DCC impact people in so many ways. It would be a shame if we had to cut programs.

It has been my pleasure to serve in many leadership roles here at DCC during the past 20 years. I am deeply thankful to the members of the Board of Trustees and Advisory team, especially Andy Zaplatynsky and Rick Hall who stood shoulder to shoulder with me as we worked through many long meetings, countless phone calls and some challenges along the way. I have equally enjoyed working with Pastor Mark and Pastor Alan and am deeply appreciative of their spiritual strength and guidance and leadership of the church we call home.
