As a result of this current crisis, please allow me to update you on a few items of importance.

All in person events and activities are suspended until further notice. If for some reason you do need access to the Church building, please call ahead.

The Church Office phone will be staffed remotely from 9AM – 4PM Monday through Friday 315-445-0331. The pastor on call line will continued to be staffed 24/7, 315-303-2308.

During this crisis, many of the ministries of the church continue, and so do the expenses. Your contributions are as critical as ever, so please continue

When we are able to resume normal activities, we will be revising our scheduled activities that we've

had to suspend during this crisis.

As many of you are aware, I was scheduled to be on sabbatical from mid-April to mid-July. Due to the current events, that plan will be altered as we navigate the challenges brought on by the virus outbreak

As we go through these unusual times, I would like to close by offering this prayer. Lord God, during these times of doubts and uncertainty, we look to you for strength and courage. Help us to live with faith, not fear as we face these challenges. Help us to take each day at a time and trust in the guidance of your Holy Spirit. Message from the Board President:

As I sit down to write this morning, an overcast sky promises an early spring rain. The rebirth of nature is just around the corner. It's perhaps inevitable that I address the role of our Church in the current pandemic. There is still much to learn about COVID-19, but it's UN clear now that its afflictions are indiscriminate — disregarding age, wealth, politics or race. We're all in this together.

As a Church so much of what we do involves physically coming together as a group for worship and fellowship, yet that is exactly what we mustn't do to slow the spread of this virus. We're fortunate to live in a time when we have the technology to offer on-line worship, devotionals and meetings. Although we've postponed a few events and limited the use of our building, it is our intent to maintain our ministries for as long as our resources permit. Our hard working staff remains dependent on your generosity as much now as during "normal" times. We endeavor to be the "virtual glue" holding our community together.

I recently read an article about two women of great age who lived through the 1918 flu pandemic, annual waves the Holocaust. of polio, the Depression, and Historically, incurable illness was relatively commonplace - we are just not used to it due to the advances of medical science. One commentator shared, "...we should all reflect on how fragile life, civility and yes, even simple kindness can be when our comforts and ordered existence starts to unravel." This Lenten season we've been reminded of Christ's Sermon on the Mount, and in one example Christ uses the rain to illustrate God's love for all humanity. He sends rain on both the just and the unjust and we're challenged to follow that example.

So, during this unsettled time we should be mindful of the needs of our neighbors. Recognize that there are those who suffer from loneliness, unemployment, or illness. Others place themselves at risk to maintain vital services. The precautions we take benefit everyone. Faced with uncertainty it's natural to feel anxiety – but try to remain patient and calm even though we can't know what will happen. Panic and selfishness are as contagious as the plague. I look forward to the day when we can all gather together again to give thanks and celebrate our deliverance. In the meantime, may we be a blessing to others like a refreshing rain.




July 19 - 23

Using historical information, archaeological data, and biblical text, this study guides us in the footsteps of this reluctant prophet who grew in his relationship with God and by the end of life had successfully fulfilled the role he was given.
