## **Flourishing**



From the Senior Minister It's winter in Syracuse, and it is cold! A huge February snowstorm dropped anywhere between 10-20 inches of snow in Central New York. We are in the middle of a global pandemic that keeps us distant socially from friends and families. Our routines have been

upended, people have lost employment and our kids are learning remotely. How do we flourish in such conditions which make it difficult to be at our best?

In 2017, I joined the Fuller Seminary Pastor and Ministry Leader Spiritual Formation Cohort funded by the Lilly Endowment. A study conducted by Fuller Seminary found that while pastors lead others in spiritual practices and formation, many pastors themselves do not receive spiritual direction. Each quarter for a year, I joined other pastors and church leaders in Southern California for spiritual formation retreats, monthly video calls and engaged in the process of spiritual direction. It was truly a life-changing experience. So much so that my small group decided to continue under Austin Seminary's College of Pastoral Leaders grant for continued spiritual formation practices.

In my spiritual formation journey, I learned an important new phrase and framework to view myself, faith, spirituality, and life: human flourishing. When I started with my spiritual formation group and cohort, I was dealing with several major life challenges with changing churches, moving, selling a home, buying a home, relinquishing my role on several national denominational boards, joining a Th.D. program and the birth of our third child. I didn't feel like I was flourishing.

Through my spiritual formation group, I learned that human flourishing is a key paradigm whereby we join in the original invitation given to human beings by God: "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it" (Gen 1:28). No matter if we work in schools, businesses, homes, warehouses, studios, shops, fields, hospitals or governments, we contribute to our community's fruitfulness and fullness. This fruitfulness, or flourishing, is for ourselves and others. In flourishing, we can thrive by taking up specific Christian spiritual practices in times of ease and strain.

During Lent, I invite you to join me in my new message series, "Flourishing." Each week, we look at scripture, practices, behaviors, and frameworks required to achieve human flourishing. This sermon series starts on February 21st, and I hope you will join me on this journey of flourishing. Also, during Lent, we have several studies, daily devotionals via email, worship services and service opportunities in which you can engage in this work of human flourishing. Please take time to read about these opportunities in the newsletter.

Please see the details below regarding volunteering:

- Two shifts are needed, and volunteers must commit to a 3 hour shift. The shifts are 9AM to Noon, and Noon to 3PM. 5 volunteers are needed for each shift. The 9AM to Noon shift is for meal preparation, and the Noon to 3PM shift is during meal serving time.
- Volunteers must be 18 years old or older
- Volunteers need to be able to stand for an entire 3 hour shift
- Volunteers need to be willing to wear a face mask at all times
- Volunteers do not have any COVID-19 symptoms or temperature, or have close contact with suspected or positive COVID-19 situation/individual in the previous 14 days
- Volunteers have not recently, within 14 days, traveled to any state which requires a 14 day quarantine on arrival to New York
   State
- Volunteers are not on any quarantine or self-isolation directive

It seems like we just said goodbye to 2020 and now we are shifting our focus to the Lenten season in preparation for Easter. I do not think it could be coming at a better time. With so many things going on in the world right now, it is understandable that one could be distracted from the spiritual preparation for Easter. Whether or not you choose to fast or exercise self-denial by giving something up, we can all benefit by using this time to reflect and spiritually prepare for the celebration of the resurrection of Christ.

One of the things I plan to spiritually reflect on during this Lenten season is how important it is for me to recognize the humanity present in everyone, even those that do not agree with me – be it spiritually, politically, or morally. We are all made in God's image: Christians, Jews, and Muslims, Democrats and Republicans. There are those that would seek to divide us for their own personal gain. We as a society must not let that happen.

I do not know if we will be able to be physically together for Easter services. However, I do know that we will be together spiritually in the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus.

# American Red Cross

We are in need of people to help with our Blood Drives. Blood Drives are a primary means for the Red Cross to collect blood for those in need. DCC sponsors 4 Blood Drives each year, and collected over 1000 units last year, but we need people to check in the donors and monitor the hospitality (cookies & juice) tables.

For those of you who would like to volunteer, but have apprehensions, please be aware that we do follow COVID guidelines, that we use gloves to take temperatures before we allow anyone to enter the donation area.

We invite you to our drive-thru communion with safe pre-packed communion elements and prayer from our Pastors.

Please wear a mask when you arrive at the halfcircle driveway in front of the church. We do have our temperature, check-in and hospitality stations spaced at least 6 feet apart and the donation tables are at least 6 ' apart. We allow only 1 person to enter the donation area at time.

We ask for volunteers in 2-hr shifts so we're not asking for you to commit your whole day, and to be a little flexible with your times.

starting February 21




