Easter is More Than One Day

Easter Sunday is the Super Bowl victory parade of Christianity. It is the celebration of victory – Jesus's victory over death and sin to give us redemption and everlasting life. And the celebration did not end there. We read in scripture the appearances of Jesus:

- * We remember that Jesus appeared to Peter (Cephas) near Jerusalem later that day (Luke 24:34, 1 Corinthians 15:5).
- To two disciples going to Emmaus that day (Mark 16:12, Luke 24:13-31).
- The evening at Jerusalem to the apostles except Thomas (Mark 16:14, John 20:19-25).
- * Sunday evening (April 16) at Jerusalem to all the apostles, especially Thomas (John 20:26-29).
- t To seven disciples fishing on Sea of Galilee (John 21:1-13).
- To eleven disciples on a mountain in Galilee (Matthew 28:16-18).
- + To over 500 disciples at once (1Corinthians 15:6).
- + To James --location uncertain (1Corinthians 15:7).
- To the apostles (and probably others) during forty days before his ascension (Acts 1:2-3).

Easter is More Than One Day

The Christian church remembers these appearances in the lectionary readings on the Sundays following Easter, which makes Easter a season of 50 days. The season of Easter helps us remember to proclaim the good news. Christian scholar N.T. Wright wrote about how the message of Easter must be shared not just one day but at all times in his book, *The Challenge of Easter:*

"Our task, as image-bearing, God-loving, Christ-shaped, Spirit-filled Christians, following Christ and shaping our world, is to announce redemption to the world that has discovered its fallenness, to announce healing to the world that has discovered its fallenness, to announce healing to the world that has discovered its brokenness, to proclaim love and trust to the world that knows only exploitation, fear and suspicion."

At DeWitt Community Church, we share the Easter message every day and in as many ways as possible. We have two exciting opportunities to hear how we are partnering with Christian organizations to share the good news:

Fellowship of Christian Athletes Sunday, April 14 – In worship at the **9** AM and **11** AM services, we will hear from Syracuse University athletes about how God has made a difference in their lives. The Fellowship of Christian Athletes, one of our mission partners, coordinates Bible studies, gatherings, service projects, and supports athletes who desire to walk with Christ daily. Several times a year, we provide dinner for the weekly huddles, which includes over 50 athletes.

El Salvador Mission Trip Sunday, April 21 – DeWitt Community Church and dozens of other churches in Syracuse, Rochester, and Buffalo sent over 80 youth and adults to Bajo Lempa, El Salvador, to serve and support villages. At the **9** AM and **11** AM worship services, you will hear from our DCC El Salvador team about the mission trip and how the worked on building stable housing, improving sanitation, working at a medical clinic, offering a shoe drive, and the impact the mission trip had on the local people.

I hope you will join us on these special Sundays to learn how we create an Easter world as an Easter people. Perhaps you will want to participate in our efforts at DeWitt Community Church through one of our partner mission ministries to make the Easter message a reality in our world.

MARCH MISSION OF THE MONTH: RESTART

Restart is an outreach ministry of Syracuse United Methodist Ministries that supports individuals and families who are restarting their lives. Some move out of shelters, while others move from places that were condemned, caught fire, or had other difficulties. Often Restart must move quickly to assist as these people begin their new lives. Restart collects household items such as furniture, dishes, bedding, and appliances. Since Restart's first delivery in 2018, the program has received over 200 donations and has enriched the lives of over 350 individuals and families.

Lack of housing across the nation continues to be a major issue for countless people so when housing becomes a reality, Restart can be there to help furnish rooms and apartments. They also work closely with other charities like Sleep in Heavenly Peace and In My Father's Kitchen.

Restart is extremely grateful for the assistance from DeWitt Community Church. Your financial assistance helps buy fuel for the U-Haul vehicles used to deliver and pick up donations. Restart can always use bedroom, living room and dining furniture along with bathroom and kitchen linens, kitchen dishes, silverware, pots and pans, and mattresses and box springs that are in good condition.

Check-in team leaders who are organized and can help families register and check-in and out for the day.


